eWaste workers always have work to do, with the amount of computers, TV's, DVD, phones and electrical appliances coming in regularly! They are stripped down and the materials are sorted into bins or fadge bags! The mother boards from computers etc are shipped off to Japan to be processed and the steel & plastics are separated, then baled & then are processed here in New Zealand!
